

AREAS OF STUDY

Other areas of study available to CVHS students include six levels of traditional world languages, extensive programs in the visual and performing arts, an award-winning music program and lab-based programs in computer science, business, finance and family and consumer science. The CVHS science curriculum features numerous outdoor learning experiences. CV's physical education/health program is recognized as a leader in best practices. The CVHS gifted program features outstanding Model UN and Mock Trial teams.

GRADING COMPUTATIONS

Class Rank is based on a **weighted** formula that uses a student's GPA, a multiplier of credits earned and extra points which are assigned to certain courses (e.g. Honors, Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment).

Grade Point Average is **unweighted**; it is based on a four-point scale and computed cumulatively at the conclusion of each year.

ACADEMIC FACILITIES

CV's modern facilities include specially-designed classrooms for art, business and computer technology. Students have access to modern scientific laboratories with digital microscopes and infrared spectrophotometer, a digital music lab, a TV production studio, 3D printing and a plasma cutter.

1:1 LEARNING TECHNOLOGY


All CVHS students receive a laptop with access to digital learning tools for use throughout the entire school year. Many areas of study utilize digital texts and virtual coursework. The entire school offers Wi-Fi access; all core classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors, electronic whiteboards and classroom performance systems; and the school is using Schoology as its main classroom and administrative management system.

EXTRACURRICULAR PROGRAMS

The high school's club program includes more than 30 student organizations, including an award-winning Technology Student Association (TSA) chapter. Extracurricular arts programs include drama and musical stage productions, competition marching band, jazz band, indoor guard and Tri-M Music Honor Society.

BUCKSKINS ATHLETICS

CVHS is home to 27 varsity sports teams and promotes a character education program called Pursing Victory With Honor. CV's athletic facilities include a state-of-the-art synthetic turf field, 2,000-seat gymnasium and modern fitness center for extensive cardio and resistance training. CV has produced more than 50 all-state student-athletes and 16 PIAA state champions.
